Kindergarten News: Miss Abby Morris & Mrs. Doyle


Hello SRA Community,

Yesterday, Kindergarten learned about Martin Luther King Junior. We continue to learn new things about shapes, place value and ways to build numbers. We are looking forward to Catholic Schools week!



First Grade News: Mrs. Louise Balicki-Smith

First Grade just finished learning about animal classification in Science. We are applying our knowledge of classification to the BBC Planet Earth series. Students are watching the series, selecting an animal classifying and drawing it based on their learning. Additional



animal, classifying and drawing it based on their learning. Additionally, students are working on a project at home to create an animal book filled with facts and examples of insects, amphibians, reptiles, mammals, fish and birds. Our brains are alive with Science!

Second Grade News: Miss Stephanie Amsler

This week Second Grade is working with words that have consonant digraphs (ch, th, sh, and wh). We know that consonant digraphs are two letters that work together to make one sound. We are also reviewing irregular plural nouns and then moving on to collective nouns. We will also begin reading more non-fiction text so we continue to build on our knowledge of comparing and contrasting two texts.

In Math we continue to work with three-digit numbers when adding. We are learning how to represent these numbers using base ten blocks and in expanded form. This will help us more clearly see how regrouping works with larger numbers. We also practiced some mental math by adding 1, 10 and 100 to a given three-digit number. The snow day last Friday caused us to alter our plans for receiving an indoor plant for our classroom. We are excited to have rescheduled the plant's arrival for this Friday. Stay tuned for updates about the progress of our indoor plant!

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Third Grade News: Ms. Susan Polson

Third Grade is trying very hard to continue being role models for the Early Childhood Floor students. Somedays they need reminders but they are rising to the occasion on other days. This Friday we are celebrating Pro-Life by being extra quiet in the halls and at school. It is our way of respecting life and paying our respect to the unborn. We have begun work on Unit 4 in English with descriptive adjectives and limiting adjectives. In Math we are working with three and six times tables. We know how important it is to memorize those basic facts so we can use our multiplication facts for story problems. We have already begun preparing for Grandparent's Day Mass on Friday, February 3!

Miss Patti Woods: Social Studies, Science, English (4-5)

<u>The Fifth Graders</u> took a wonderful trip to the Old Chain of Rocks Bridge for Eagle Days. We were able to see a few eagles in the wild, but we were also able to see two that were being rehabbed up close. They are such majestic symbols of our country. It was a great day! In Fifth Grade English we are working on capitalization and punctuation. We also did a lesson on interjections. In Social Studies we will be working on the processes of our government, such as the branches of our government and what they are responsible for. In Science, we are going to be reviewing all we learned about force and motion.

<u>In Fourth Grade</u> English we are focusing on adjectives. Our main area of study in Social Studies is the Louisiana Purchase and the Westward Expansion and how it has affected our country. In Science we are looking at force and motion, though not as in depth as with the Fifth Grade.

Miss Amanda Imo: Reading, Math (4-5)

<u>Fifth Grade:</u> In Religion the students have been studying the parts of the Mass. We have made it to the end and are focusing on the Concluding Rites. During Math the students are focusing on multiples, divisibility rules, exponents and factors all to help prepare for the upcoming chapters on fractions. The students read a section from one of Laura Ingalls Wilder famous books. We concentrated on finding the mood in the story and also how to draw conclusions.

Fourth Grade: The Fourth Graders are continuing their work with dividing large numbers. With practice, the students are getting much more efficient. During Reading the students are working with their story "The Turtle Who Wanted to Fly." This week they acted as if they were a play critic and wrote a review of the play.

Mrs. Christy Connor: Social Studies & Religion (6-7-8)

English:

Students in Grades Six, Seven, and Eight will complete their study of different forms of sentences this week. They will then begin to learn about or review the kinds of nouns, including common, proper, compound, collect, concrete and abstract.

Social Studies:

Grade Six students are beginning a unit on the various African kingdoms of the past.

Grade Seven students are completing their study of the American Revolution and will begin to learn about the United States Constitution.

Grade Eight students will be completing their study of World War II. This will be followed by learning about the Cold War.

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Mrs. Laura Berns: Science (6-7-8) Standard Math (6-7-8) Miss Ashley Schaaf: Science (6-7-8) Challenge Math (6&7) Algebra 8

6th - 8th MATH

In challenge math this week...

Sixth Grade is finishing up chapter 4 over tables and graphs. They will take their test Wednesday, and will move on to Chapter 5 at the end of the week.

<u>Seventh Grade</u> is finishing up Chapter 5 over ratios and proportions. We will review and they will take their test on Thursday.

<u>Eighth Grade</u> is finishing up Chapter 7 over systems of equations and inequalities. We will be reviewing on Thursday and they will take the test next Monday.

In Standard Math this week...

<u>Sixth Grade</u> is wrapping-up our lesson on identifying geometric figures and is beginning to plot points on a coordinate plane.

<u>Seventh Grade</u> is finishing up solving and identifying proportional relationships. They will be moving on to similar figures and scale drawings.

<u>Eighth Grade</u> is continuing to solve systems of equations using substitution and elimination. We are finding that the Simple Solutions help pages are a great resource.

6th - 8th SCIENCE

Eighth Grade is finishing up Chapter 3 in Chemical Interactions. This covers acids, bases, and solutions. They will take their test on Wednesday and work on Science Fair at the end of the week.

Seventh Grade just completing a lab activity. They had to create a water filter using gravel, sand, charcoal, nylon, coffee filters, cotton and a water bottle. Check out St. Raphael's Facebook page for some fun pictures.

Sixth Grade is continuing to investigate different types of mammals. This week we are digging into reptiles and fishes.

Mrs. Jennifer Runiewicz: Literature (6-7-8)

<u>Literature:</u> Students continue to surge through our Holocaust novels. We are learning about the difficult decisions and situations surrounding the victims of the Holocaust and the character that was built in each person because of those situations. Please ask your student to share the stories of those they are learning about.

<u>Vocabulary Workshop</u> schedule should be taped/stapled to their vocabulary book cover or in their assignments books. I've also shared the schedule with each of them on Google Drive. Our Unit 9 spelling a vocabulary test will be Wednesday, February 1st.

Families have the opportunity to apply for all the scholarships listed below using the unified online application <u>at no cost</u>. To make the process easier for families and schools, one application is now being used for all scholarships funded by the Catholic Education Office, the Roman Catholic Foundation of Eastern Missouri, and the Today & Tomorrow Educational Foundation. The Scholarship Office at TTEF will review your application and determine if your family is eligible for any awards based on each program's guidelines and funding availability.
