



The Visual Learner

Over the next few weeks I will explain three different ways that children learn. You may already be familiar with the three terms used: visual, auditory and kinesthetic/tactile learner.

This week I will begin with the VISUAL LEARNER.

What the learner requires:

Clear visual cues, to see the big picture, to see action on the board, opportunity to jot or write notes, as well as visual praise.

What the teacher can offer:

Drawings, worksheets, charts, graphic organizers, mapping, webbing, a seat near the activity, visual cues on the board for ease of copying, color codes, notes home to parents, stickers for praise.

ADDITIONAL TOOLS TO HELP THE VISUAL LEARNER:

Have the student use the computer for written expression, use graphs and charts, handouts, maps, posters, lists. Have them close their eyes to recall visual pictures, they benefit from actually making the visuals themselves that accompany the work.

Parents can look for these other characteristic of VISUAL LEARNERS:

They tend to follow you around the room with their eyes, they notice what people are wearing or what their facial expressions are, they are quick to "judge a book by its cover" as they rely on visual input, they may read better silently rather than orally, use pictures for story starters, use colored flash cards for rehearsal of facts, students often times appear to be "daydreaming" when directions are being given, so getting them involved will engage their attention.

Mrs. Peggy Martin: Physical Education & Art Grades Pk-3

This week in PE we are continuing in hockey. Preschool and Kindergarten are experiencing shuffling/dribbling, shooting and moving with the sticks and pucks. This week I will replace the pucks with balls. It is faster moving and requires more practice of the skill. It is also great practice for special relationships. First, Second and Third Grades will be studying the floor hockey positions and line changing (substitution). We will play in a game situation that they really seem to enjoy. Have a great week.

Mr. John Bruno: Physical Education—Grades 3-8

We will be winding down basketball skills this week. Over the last few weeks the students learned good basketball drills, games and conditioning activities that will help enhance their own individual skills while playing in CYC or other basketball leagues. This week I introduced a game that the students really seemed to enjoy. It was a two on two basketball game with each game lasting only thirty seconds. Every student was focused, engaged and really had lots of fun.

I look forward to introducing my students to the next activity.



Second Grade News: Miss Stephanie Amsler

This week Second Grade students are working with collective nouns. We know that collective nouns are used to talk about a group of things. For example, a group of geese is called a gaggle. We have had fun trying to find collective nouns in books we are reading. We continue to read non-fiction text about similar topics so that we can compare and contrast them. Reading these non-fiction texts will help us with our informative writing.

In Math we continue to work with three-digit numbers. We have now begun subtracting them using base ten blocks.

We were pleasantly surprised when our indoor plant arrived as an indoor garden! We are growing many different kinds of leafy greens: Rainbow Chard, Sweet Basil, Arugula, Bok Choy and Bibb Lettuce. We have begun charting the growth of each of these plants and can't wait to share with everyone! Hopefully we will grow enough to use as a salad one day for lunch.



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Third Grade News: Ms. Susan Polson

Third Grade read a couple of great short fiction stories, *Grandaddy's Place* and Suzy Kline's *The Ghost of Annabelle*. We did some writing assignments after reading and discussing. They especially loved writing "Get Well" poems and sharing those aloud. We are continuing with our Multiplication Facts and finding the missing factor in problems. Story problems can be challenging, but we are working hard. Our class is gearing up for Grandparents Mass on February 3rd. We also take charge of the Angelus Prayer over the loudspeaker in the office during February. Ms Polson is emphasizing clarity of voice, public speaking skills and word enunciation. This will help us when we present our President Reports (written copy due Monday, February 13th) to the class.

Miss Patti Woods: Social Studies, Science, English (4-5)

In both Fourth and Fifth Grades we are preparing to take unit tests. Fourth Grade will be studying for Unit 4, Adjectives. Fifth Grade will be studying for Unit 5, Capitalization and Punctuation.

In Fourth Grade Science we have been learning about force and motion. In Social Studies we have been learning about the Louisiana Purchase and the impact it had on the United States. The Louisiana Purchase test will be Friday, January 27th.

In Grade Five Science we are also learning about force and motion. In Social Studies our topic of discussion has been on the Branches of the Government. The first branch we have been studying is the Executive Branch.

Miss Amanda Imo: Reading, Math (4-5)

<u>Fifth Grade:</u> This week in Religion the students are reviewing all of the Parts of the Mass that they learned about during Unit 2. During Math the students are beginning a unit on fractions and they are working on discovering ways to make equivalent fractions and finding simplest form. In Reading the students are working on determining theme.

Fourth Grade: The students are getting more proficient with dividing large numbers. During Reading we read a story about a class doing Book Reports. Our focus was on character description and connecting lessons from the story to our own lives.

Mrs. Christy Connor: Social Studies & Religion (6-7-8)

English:

Students in Sixth, Seventh, and Eighth Grade have completed the unit about sentences. They are all now working with the different kinds of nouns, including common, proper, concrete, abstract, compound and collective nouns.

Social Studies:

Grade Six students are discovering facts about some of the kingdoms and empires found in Africa.

Grade Seven students are learning how and why the United States Articles of Confederation was replaced by the Constitution.

Students in Grade Eight have completed the section about World War II and are beginning to learn about the period of history known as the Cold War.

6th - 8th Grade Math

Sixth Grade SMath

We are continuing with our geometry unit - reviewing complementary and supplementary. We will begin finding perimeter of regular and irregular figures at the end of the week.

Sixth Grade Challenge

This week we are starting a new chapter on ratios and rates.

Seventh Grade SMath

We are identifying similar figures and finding missing side lengths.

Seventh Grade Challenge

This week we are starting a new chapter over proportions and percents.

Eighth Grade SMath

We just took a quiz over solving systems of equations using substitution and elimination. Our next lessons will require students to solve systems of equations by graphing.

Eighth Grade Challenge

Monday we took a test over systems of equations and inequalities. We are moving on and introducing the new chapter over exponents and exponential functions.

6th - 8th Grade Science

In Sixth Grade we are creating a diagram to review all vertebrate animals.

In Seventh Grade we just finished building our filtration systems. We will have a test at the end of this week.

Eighth Grade is working on Chapter 4 that covers polymers and composites, as well as metals and alloys. We are working on science fair projects on Wednesday.
