
## Kindergarten News: Miss Abby Morris & Mrs. Charis Doyle

The first grade students had a wonderful trip to the zoo this month. One of their favorite parts of the zoo was meeting some animals up close in the class we took about animal life cycles. With the weather hopefully changing over to spring, we are hoping to move more of our classes outside. In the picture below, the students were working on compound words with chalk on the parking lot. #### Second Grade News: Mark Messmer

It is hard to believe we have a little more than a month left of school. The year has flown by, and we are making the best of our time left in second grade. In reading and writing, we have been exploring fiction stories and story elements. In religion, we are so excited to have celebrated Bow Sunday on April 15th and will be celebrating our First Communion on April 29th. Finally, we wrapped up our study of animal life cycles with a field trip to the zoo with first grade. Besides exploring the animals around the zoo, we took a class on different types of life cycles where we got to see a hissing cockroach, a frog, and a guinea pig.



#### Third Grade News: Ms. Susan Polson

Third graders have learned some classic card games that are educational. We know children's authors, classic authors, women authors, inventors, explorers, presidents, and Indian chiefs. We read *Stone Soup* and wrote salad recipes. We are working on some food poems for Mrs. Ruggeri (shhhh). In Treasures, we read a story called "The Printer" about a deaf man who warned his fellow workers about a fire in the printing press factory. They



learned sign language to surprise him. In English, we focused on pronouns (took a test on Chapter 6) and point of view. Ms Polson read a book *Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes*. For Math, we have been working on two-digit numbers multiplied by a one-digit number, and division with remainders. We also worked on multi-step word problems. We prayed for the Confirmation Class and made them cards.

## Miss Patti Woods: English (4 - 8)

The fourth graders had a wonderful time going to the Old Courthouse to reenact the Dred Scott Trial. They then had time to go to the park and enjoy a picnic lunch and some time to play. Now we will be getting back to work on pronouns.







The fifth graders are finishing their work on prepositions and will be taking a test on Wednesday, April 25.


The sixth and seventh graders are back at work after enjoying their week at camp. They are writing a story about their camp experience.

The eighth graders are finishing their unit on phrases. Next up will be their final English unit, clauses.

#### Miss Amanda Imo: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

**Fifth Grade:** The fifth graders have been studying about the Sacraments of Holy Orders and Matrimony. They have finished learning about all seven sacraments and assembled the Sacrament Books as a keep-sake for what they learned about each sacrament. In Math, we switched gears to Geometry. We have been working on measuring and drawing angles, reviewing line relationships, and determining polygon figures. The students have been working on finding the main ideas in the story during Literature. Discussing the importance of figurative language and how it can enhance a story has been another topic.

**Fourth Grade:** The fourth graders have been learning about the Beatitudes and how they can relate them to their own lives. During Math, we have moved on to Geometry, and have been excited to use protractors and learn how to draw and measure angles. They have also learned about the types of angles and lines. The students have been working on finding the theme of a story during Literature class. The students are also working on characterization.



# Mrs. Jennifer Runiewicz: Literature (6-8) Religion (7-8)

Literature classes have taken a dive, head first, into our Shakespeare unit. 8th grade is reading *Romeo and Juliet*, 7th, *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, and 6th, *The Taming of the Shrew*. Although the language used by William Shakespeare is often difficult for the students to interpret, the story lines are quite good, both amusing and tragic. Please encourage students to review and complete their summaries and questions from the daily reading every night. Shakespeare is a difficult genre to get through, but with constant review, the students will be successful.

During this last month, 8th grade religion has focused on how science impacted the Church, Catholic Social Teaching, and the Catholic Church through the Renaissance period.

We will end our year with Family Life, where we cover God's gifts of family, self, life, love, and community at an age appropriate level in both 7th and 8th grade religion classes.

7th Grade, although already confirmed, will complete the confirmation program, Chosen, before the end of the school year.

Vocabulary Workshop schedule should be taped/stapled to your student's vocabulary book cover or in their assignment notebooks. I have also shared the schedule with each of them on Google Drive. Unit 14 Quiz is scheduled for Tuesday, May1st and Unit 15 Quiz will be on Tuesday, May 15th.
