Mrs. Connie Holbrook: Religion (5), Math (4-6), Literature/Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

I hope that everyone has a blessed Christmas holiday!


Fifth Grade: During Religion the students will be learning about the parts of Mass in detail. They will also be working on reading stories in book B in Literature. The focus in math will be dividing decimals, then beginning fraction concepts.

Fourth Grade: The focus in math will be Unit 4, multiplying by 1 and 2 digit numbers. Literature class will be stories in book B. While reading the students will learn more about the point of view in the stories.

Sixth Grade Standard Math: Now that Chapter 4 has been covered, students will move onto Chapter 5 which covers all fraction operations. There will be a quiz halfway through the chapter on adding and sub-tracting fractions.

Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

6-7-8 just started the Unit on Thermal Energy, Heat Transfers and the Different Temperature Scales.



Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion: Grade Six students have learned about the Ten Commandments and are studying how the Israelites finally are able to return to the Promised Land. Grade Eight students are completing their study of the Catholic Church in the first century. They are about to begin exploring the Church in the Middle Ages.

Social Studies: Grade 6 students are completing their study of the cultures and geography of North Africa and Southwest Asia. Grade 7 students will be discovering the roots of Islam as part of their world history program. Grade 5 students are learning about the Midwest Region and are continuing their study of the American Revolution. Grade 8 students are about to complete the Civil War and will begin study of the period of Reconstruction that followed.

Mr. Zach Almeida: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

Algebra 2: Students are graphing rational functions using intercepts and asymptotes to draw a sign diagram.

Challenge: Students solving problems using fractions, decimals and percents.

Algebra 1: Students are applying properties of exponents to simplify expressions.

Pre-Algebra: Students are using properties of angles to solve for a missing angle in figures and triangles.

Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8)

The middle school students composed informational pieces. The 6th graders wrote reports on animals. The 7th graders wrote reports on enslaved people and abolitionists. The 8th graders wrote reports on world leaders--some of them famous and some of them infamous.

Along with researching and paraphrasing, the students used strategies to make the beginning engaging as well as make the conclusion satisfying.
