With the quickly approaching final Sunday of Advent this weekend and the last day of school before the Christmas break on Friday, December 20, it seems appropriate to wish our school families a Merry Christmas and a peaceful holiday break. May all your gatherings with family and friends bring joy and happiness.

I sent a reminder out on Monday that **Friday, December 20, is a NOON DISMISSAL with NO AFTERCARE.** Please ensure you have arranged your childcare plans accordingly because the faculty and staff will head off campus to the faculty & staff Christmas party.

Christmas Parties will begin at 11:00 AM for grades K-8 on Friday, and the Preschool parties will also take place on Friday morning, but earlier. Ms. Molly and Ms. Tracy have communicated those times. Remember you must be in compliance with Protecting God's Children if you are helping with the class parties. All parents must sign in at the office.
