

#### Miss Gretchen Decker: Art

There was a good amount of artwork created in February! Here is what each grade made:

<u>Pre-K:</u> They created some small pieces of art like Valentine Trees, Emotions, Lent Art, etc. Now they are starting to create Four Leaf Clovers to celebrate St. Paddy's Day!

<u>Kindergarten–1st:</u> These students learned how to make some origami, valentine's day oil pastel drawings, and learned about Antoni Gaudi.

<u>2nd–3rd:</u> These students learned how to make origami, valentine's day acrylic painting, and completed a color mixing. Now they'll be creating an SRA mural out of yarn that is inspired by the "We the People" artwork from Crystal Bridges!

<u>4th–8th:</u> These students finished their art museum posters and are now starting their Still Life and Contour Drawing Projects! Both projects practice their observational skills along with drawing skills. I hope everyone has a great rest of their month along with the great weather coming in! (One can only hope it stays)

#### Miss Patti Woods: English (4 & 5) Religion (4 & 7) Social Studies (4) Literature (4)

4th Grade Social Studies and English: After watching two movies about Civil Rights, the students are working together in groups to write a comparison/contrast of the two movies, *Ruby Bridges* and *Selma, Lord, Selma.* We have also been working hard on the *Dred Scott Trial*.

4th Grade English: The students just finished a unit and took a test on verbs. They will begin studying adjectives now.

4th Grade Religion: Students have just finished their studies of the Ten Commandments and have created a slide show. Next, they will be studying The Beatitudes.

4th Grade Literature: We are busy reading the award-winning novel The Watsons Go to Birmingham-1963.

5th Grade English: The students will just be finishing a unit on capitalization and punctuation. They will be taking a test on the unit at the end of this week.

7th Grade Religion: Students are continuing their work in preparation for their Confirmation at the end of April.

#### Mrs. Katie Meier: Religion (5), Math (4-6), Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

The 5th grade is finishing our third novel of the school year, Esperanza Rising. In Religion we are learning about the sacrament of Holy Orders and the Liturgical Season of Lent. In Math we are still in our Fraction Era! The end of February also brought the beginning of our JA BizTown program and we are preparing for our Field Trip to BizTown on 4/25.

4th Grade Math just started working with fractions; renaming, reducing to simplest form, and adding and subtracting!

6th Grade Standard Math is working on geometry and studying area and perimeter of different shapes.

6th Grade Challenge Math is finishing their unit on percent of change and simple interest.

We are all ready to finish the 3rd Quarter strong!

#### Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

4TH Grade Science: Fourth Grade is finishing up Weathering, Erosion, and Landforms and will be going into the Unit on Volcanoes and Earthquakes.

5TH Grade Science: Just finished learning about stars, galaxies and the universe and our solar system. We will be learning the phases of the Moon and why we have seasons.

6TH,7TH & 8TH Science: Are still finishing up the Jigsaw Project with each group teaching one of the Human Body Systems. Then we will be going into the Unit on Adaptations and Natural Selection.

#### Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion: Students in Grade 6 are beginning to study the Kings of Israel, beginning with King Saul. Students in Grade 8 continue to learn about Church history and the men and women who helped our Church grow.

Social Studies: Students in Grades 5 and 8 have begun exploring the causes and effects of the Civil War. Students in Grades 5 and 8 have begun exploring the causes and effects of the cultures. Grade 7 students are studying the beginnings of Islam and how it spread throughout the Middle East.

#### Mrs. Anne Stein: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

The middle school students are continuing to work hard in math. The 7th Grade Challenge class is beginning to learn about different ways of analyzing and representing data. The Pre-Algebra class is studying experimental and theoretical probability. The Algebra I students are learning about the properties of exponents and exponential functions. The Algebra II class is working on solving quadratic equations and operations with polynomials.

#### Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8)

#### 6th-8th ELA

The middle-schoolers are taking notes, in preparation for an argumentative piece. We are in the midst of nonfiction writing. All 3 grades are also working on their Civitas project (a project with a model UN here in St. Louis). We are researching our countries (each student is a "delegate" for a foreign country of their choice) and will eventually create a resolution to "solve" a problem that country has. We will be taking part in a General Assembly with Civitas on April 17.

The 6th and 7th graders are about to begin reading a new novel. The 8th graders are still immersed in *Unbroken*, which is a true story of a WWII Olympian and Airman who becomes a captive at a Japanese POW camp.
