Hello SRA Families,

Catholic Schools Week is always a special week for our community. We brought back the coffee and donuts for drop-off and Family Trivia this year, which was fun, and the teachers enjoyed a delicious lunch and extra time to enjoy each other's company. Today, the classes enjoyed a fun day playing on huge blow-up slides and obstacle courses in the gym and playing games in the classrooms, along with a special treat at lunch. We know all will always enjoy Grandparents' Day! Whew, we are all tired, for sure! Hope your kids enjoyed it, too!

This month, we experienced a staffing change. Our nurse, Kate Dawson, had to resign for personal reasons. At this time, Mrs. Shaver and I will cover the nursing duties just like we did before we had a nurse. Please send all correspondence regarding the nurse to both of us, and we will help you. I will keep you posted if anything changes.

Morning Drop-Off- Thank you for your patience and understanding with the January morning drop-off. The ice and snow have been challenging for all, but hopefully, this warm weather will help to shrink the ice piles. I do have one concern to share with families. We prefer that students exit their cars on the school side for safety reasons, but sometimes that is not possible because of car seats with younger children on the school side. When that is the case, and a child needs to exit from the driver's side of the car, we would like for the student to walk in front of the parent's car. I want each parent to observe their child making it safely to the other side before driving off. We had a situation where a parent drove off as their child walked behind the family car, but the next car didn't see the child crossing. There is a lot going on when children exit the vehicles, so paying attention to everything happening in the car in front of you is not always possible. Please advise and remind your child to cross in front of your car when exiting on the driver's side. Thank you.

Summer Camp is happening this year! Mrs. Franz and Miss Decker will take the lead. Registration information is on the website now. Snow Days—What a strange January this has been with the weather and having to use all three snow days in one week! Going forward, if we need to call school off because of inclement weather, we will implement AMI days—**Alternative Methods of Instruction Days**. This is a little different than the traditional virtual day because we will not send home devices as we did in the past. Teachers in the Upper Grades will send lessons through their Google Classroom platform and offer office hours to Zoom for student questions. Teachers in the younger grades will email a packet of activities for the students to complete. Not all families have devices for each child to attend lessons throughout the day, so the packets may have extended due dates for completion. Also, parents may have to work and may need to wait until the evening to be able to assist their child if required. Hopefully, we won't need any more snow days, but I wanted you to know what will happen if we do. Additional instructions will be sent if that time comes.

Let me end with a reminder about **Grandparents' Day tomorrow**. Grandparents are to find a seat in the church, and the students will come to them. Students can leave with their Grandparents at any time during the morning, but they must sign out at one of the three locations: the main foyer, gym entrance, or cafeteria entrance. No aftercare is tomorrow. Students who do not leave with their grandparents must be picked up by noon.

Thank you to all the families for your support during Catholic Schools Week. Thank you to the faculty and staff who planned and organized this fun week. CSW doesn't just happen without great people!

Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion:

The students in grade six are learning how the Israelites finally entered the Promised Land.

The students in eighth grade are continuing their study of the Catholic Church's early history in the first and second centuries.

Social Studies:

Students in grades five are studying the Mexican American War and how the United States achieves Manifest Destiny.

Sixth grade students are continuing their study of the continent and cultures of Africa.

The students in grade 7 are finding information about the ancient Roman Empire.

Grade eight students are beginning to discover the causes and effects of the Civil War.

Mrs. Anne Stein: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

The 6th Challenge Math Class is finishing our unit on operations with decimals and fractions and will begin learning about expressions and equations.

The 7th Challenge math class is finishing their unit on proportions and percents and will begin learning about rational numbers.

The Pre-Algebra classes are working on solving one variable algebraic equations.

The Algebra I class is learning about writing and graphing inequalities to represent real-life situations.

The Algebra II class is working on solving rational equations and equations with radicals.

6th-8th ELA:

The middle schoolers are about to begin their next informative writing piece--it will be interviewing the parish priests.

The novels are almost finished. The students have been having Socratic discussions about them, along with writing diary "entries" from the perspective of one of the characters.

Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

4th Grade Science is learning Scientific Classification started by Karl Linnaeus which includes Binomial Nomenclature: Kingdoms down to Genus and species. And also learning how to use Dichotomous Keys in identifying living things.

5th Grade Science are learning the different BIOMES around the world finishing up a group Poster or Slide Presentation on one of the biomes.

6/7/8th Grade Science are learning the different types of Weathering of rocks, physical and chemical, and how the final product results in the different types of soils found around the world and the characteristics of the different soils.
