Dear SRA Families,

March just flew by this year. One day, we were still cold and threatened with snow, and the next, we had warm, windy weather as spring had arrived! We returned from Spring Break with only one week of March left, and before you know it, we are inching into April.

April brings many important events for families to note. I still prefer my paper planner, so when I turned the page to April, I was taken aback by just how many events we have scheduled.

For the past two years, we have had a School Improvement Committee in action with faculty members and parents meeting, gathering data, and creating goals in the areas of Catholic Identity, Education, and Institution for our school. The committees have done an excellent job of discussing the future of our school. We will culminate this endeavor by hosting a visiting team at our school next week.

The SIP team will be at St. Raphael on Thursday, April 3, and Friday, April 4. Over the two days, they will review the School Improvement document, visit classrooms, and meet with key stakeholders. Once they finish assessing our goals, they will present their recommendations to the Pastor, the Principal, and the Co-Chairperson. The approved goals will become the focus for the School Board and administration to implement over the next five years. This process allows St. Raphael the Archangel School to remain accredited in Missouri.

We welcome our visiting team of principals, teachers, and a director from the Archdiocese of St. Louis to our school next week. We also send out our appreciation to our committee members for their dedication and quality discussions to create a comprehensive report to share with the visiting team. We have a great school and community!

The 7th Grade Safety Patrols will attend the Cardinals' 12:15 PM baseball game on **Wednesday, April 2.** Mrs. Stein has already sent home permission slips and gathered parent drivers.

Spring Pictures will be held on Thursday, April 10. For this session, students will dress up in their best springtime clothing. This is an out-of-uniform day. The photographer will begin once the students return from mass. We start with the preschool first, so if your preschooler does not attend school on this day, you can arrive around 9:00 am.

Family Mass is on Sunday, April 13, Palm Sunday. The 7th-grade families will lead this mass, which is the second and final Family Mass of this school year. Thank you to Jeanne Magee for all her help and support with the Family Mass program this year. This year, we started a new tradition where the Confirmation class and their families take the leadership role for the Family Masses. Please mark your calendar with the Family Mass on Palm Sunday.

Our 5th-graders have been learning ballroom dancing through the Dancing Classroom program this year. We added this program last year, and our students learned so much, which is why I am excited to see our 5th graders experience this for themselves. Families of our 5th graders are invited to view the **Dress Rehearsal on Wednesday, April 16, from 2:00 to 3:00 PM in the gym**. Our younger students up to 4th grade will also attend. The final Dance Competition will be hosted at St. Gabriel on Wednesday, April 23.

Easter Break begins on Holy Thursday, April 17, and continues through Good Friday, Holy Saturday, Easter, and Easter Monday. Classes will resume on Tuesday, April 22. We spend the entire Lenten season preparing the students for the Resurrection of Our Lord, which we celebrate on Easter, but the Tridium days are also essential to honor. We encourage families to take this time to share the Catholic Easter traditions and ceremonies with their children.

The second grade will receive First Holy Communion on Sunday, May 4. The students will not have school the following day. In preparation for the Sacrament, they will have a fun Activity Day on Friday, April 25, and they will receive their white bows on Bow Sunday, April 27, at the 9 AM Mass. The final 1st Communion Practice and Tailgate Meal will take place on Thursday, May 1, starting at 6:00 PM.

The seventh grade will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Monday, May 5, at 7 PM, followed by a reception in the gym. The students will not have school the following day. The seventh graders will receive red bows at the 4:30 PM Mass on Saturday, April 26.

The Night of Entertainment event has been moved to Monday, April 28, at 6:30 PM. It is no longer on the April 29. Mrs. Roslawski is the director of this event.

Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion:

The students in sixth grade have completed their study of the Judges and will learn about the Kings after spring break.

The eighth grade students are continuing their study of Catholic Church history. They are currently learning about the Church during the Renaissance.

Social Studies:

Students in grades 5 and 8 learned about the Civil War. Grade 5 students are working on information about the Oregon Trail. The eighth graders are about to begin their study of World War I. Grade six students have begun studying Southeast Asia, and grade seven students will be looking at information about the empires of ancient Africa.

Mrs. Anne Stein: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

In 6th Challenge Math, the students are working with proportional relationships and exploring circles. In 7th Challenge Math, the class is working on writing and solving equations. In Pre-Algebra, the students are learning about the different ways to represent functions and will begin exploring the volume of cylinders and cones. In Algebra, the students are interpreting and analyzing functions. In Algebra 2, the students are beginning to work with imaginary numbers and the quadratic formula.

Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8)

<u>6th-8th ELA:</u> We're in the middle of two books. each of which has the story told via free verse poetry (7th and 8th) *and* we've dived into a book that is a "classic" and is incredibly well-crafted and deep (6th grade). We're writing poetry/essays (for a Missouri Botanical Garden writing competition), along with more informative pieces.

Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

5th Grade Science is learning about the Life Cycle of Stars and the two main paths stars can go through.
