Happy Spring to our SRA Families,

Yes, the weather is getting warmer, the days are growing longer, and Easter is quickly approaching. Yesterday, Palm Sunday marked the beginning of Holy Week. The school will be closed this week on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Monday. Please check the bulletin for confessions, adoration, Stations of the Cross, and Mass times.

We also celebrated Bow Sunday for our 7th-graders as they prepare for Confirmation on April 6. We are very honored to have Archbishop Rozanski coming to confirm our students at St. Raphael this year. As you drive through the neighborhood and see a red bow on the front door, be sure to say a prayer for our students.

Once again, students are to quarantine from school for five (5) days from the return date. Miss Patti Woods: English (4 & 5) Religion (4 & 7) Social Studies (4)

We all enjoyed our Spring Break, and we are eagerly awaiting the day of our Lord's Resurrection from the dead.

The fifth and sixth graders have been busy writing a comparison/contrast essay in English class. We will be sharing them this week.

In Social Studies, the fourth-grade pods each took a topic, researched it, and presented their information to the class. These included Thomas Jefferson, Missouri Laws, The Bill of Rights, The Missouri Constitution, and Missouri State Laws. They all enjoyed doing this and hope to do it again.

In fourth-grade religion, we are wrapping up our studies of the Ten Commandments, and we will then move on to The Beatitudes.

Mrs. Amanda Knauer: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: The fifth graders are studying the Sacraments at the Service of Communion. They are learning about how to listen for their calling and the various types of vocations. During math, the students are learning how to add and subtract mixed numbers and how to multiply fractions. The students read a humorous story about a cowboy that has outrageous skills during literature. They learned about hyperboles and then created their own creative story using hyperboles!

Fourth Grade: The fourth graders have been working on fractions. They learned how to find equivalent fractions, simplify fractions, compare/order, and, add/subtract fractions. The students have been working on comparing/contrasting along with sequencing in literature class.

Mrs. Dana Lahm: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

4th Grade students are exploring the different types of forces and motion.

5th Grade students are studying our Solar System and the revolution of the planets around the sun. Students are learning about earth's movements of rotation and revolution and how the positions of the moon, earth, and sun cause the phases of the moon, eclipses, and tides.

 $6^{\rm th}$, $7^{\rm th}$, & $8^{\rm th}$ Grade students are learning about the chemical reactions of photosynthesis and cellular respiration, and the processes of mechanical and chemical digestion.
