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Mrs. Kathy Doty: Music

The following are areas being covered in music

Pre K: We have been reviewing songs that we have done throughout the year. Beat, tempo, types of rhythm instruments and long and short sounds.

<u>Kindergarten:</u> We have been reviewing tempo, rhythms using Ta and TiTi notes and listening to high and low sounds.

First grade: We have been reviewing verse, refrain, words that rhyme in a song, rhythm patterns with quarter, half and eighth notes.

<u>Second grade</u>: We have been reviewing music symbols, notes and rests, and how many beats they receive, sixteenth notes, and singing their favorite songs from the year.

Third grade: We have been reviewing the sounds of various rhythm instruments, ballads, The Carnival of the Animals, and what was your favorite song?

Fourth grade: We have been reviewing the staff, lines and spaces, styles of music, besides instruments how can we add rhythm to a song, (clapping, snapping, patting knees, etc.)?

<u>Fifth grade:</u> We have been reviewing vocabulary, presentation of rhythm scores with a poem (from ABA). They have worked in groups.

Sixth - Eighth grades: The students made presentations of their theme and variations. They chose a song from a list provided and worked in a group to create four variations based upon their song of choice.

Miss Amanda Imo: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: In religion the students have been working on Family Life. We have been discussing communication, change, and the sacredness of life. During math, the focus is on finding the perimeter, area, and volume of shapes. The students worked on summarizing the beginning of the book <u>Number the Stars</u> in literature class. We are continuing to read the rest of the book.

Fourth Grade: The fourth graders have been working with measurement conversions. They created a "gallon man" to help them remember capacity conversions. The students are also working on finding the perimeter and area. During literature, the students read a story entitled "Yagua Days." The students worked on comparing and contrasting setting and describing events. They also read a non-fiction story about a girl who had a sister with cerebral palsy. The students worked on questioning the text and determining the author's purpose.



Mr. John Bruno: Physical Education

During the last few weeks, the students participated in a variety of PE activities. Different grades worked with small and large parachutes, stacking cups and fitness activities. I'm so proud of the preschool students! Throughout the year, the preschoolers have worked on and demonstrated an understanding of the difference between locomotor and non-locomotor skills. They have worked in small groups on a variety of skills through games and other fitness activities. The superheroes were an

added plus to the classes this year. I continue to stress to all the students the importance of cooperation in small groups and the ability to interact positively with their fellow classmates. It's also very important to display good sportsmanship.

We have just one week of this school year left, let's use it to keep up the good work and to really encourage one another. My hope is that all students and their families have a wonderful and safe summer.
