Dear SRA Families,

I would first like to wish all of St. Raphael's families a very blessed Thanksgiving Holiday. Not only is it a good time to pause for a few days to give thanks for all the goodness in our lives, but it is also lovely to have a few days to spend with family and friends as we prepare for Advent.

Once we return from our Thanksgiving Break on December 2, we will celebrate the first week of Advent and light the first Advent candle—this candle represents HOPE— the hope and anticipation of Christ's coming, recalling the prophecies about the Messiah and the hope He brings to the world.

Our Second Graders will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time on Wednesday, December 4 at 6:30 PM. Please keep the second graders and their families in your prayers during this time.

The students in grades 5-8 will attend confessions on Monday, December 9, and grades 3 & 4 will attend on Tuesday, December 10. Both sessions will take place directly after the 8 AM Mass.

Students are to wear their "Christmas Best" for the program. It will surely be an event to get everyone excited for Christmas. More information about the evening program will be sent through the teachers.

We will celebrate the **Feast of the Immaculate Conception** this year on Monday, December 9. The school will be in session on this day, and all the students will attend 8 AM Mass.

We have two half days in December - one with aftercare and one without aftercare.


CYC City-County Champions! Wow, this is a huge achievement! Congrats!

4th Grade Religion: Students have just finished Unit Two: We Honor Mary and will begin their study of how we show our love for Jesus. In this unit, We will be studying the Ten Commandments.

4th Grade English: Students will be continuing their work on learning about verbs. They will also begin writing an essay soon after Thanksgiving.

Religion:

Students in grade six are learning about the wilderness journey of the Israelites as they return to the Promised Land.

Social Studies:

Grades five and eight are looking at the U.S. Constitution and will soon begin units on westward expansion. Grade six students have begun a unit on the cultures of Russia and Central Asia.

Mrs. Anne Stein: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

In 6th Challenge Math, the students are working on solving problems involving fractions, including dividing fractions, and finding areas and volumes.

In 7th Challenge Math, the students are studying proportional relationships with fractions and solving problems with percentages.

The Pre-Algebra class is learning about linear equations and systems of equations.

The Algebra class is learning about organizing data and creating scatter plots.

The Algebra II students are working on factoring and solving polynomial equations and inequalities.

6th-8th ELA

We're in our last week of NaNoWriMo (National Novel Writing Month). Each grade has a word count goal (6,000 for 6th, 7,000 for 7th and 8,000 for 8th). The students had the luxury of choosing what kind of story (fictional) that they wanted to write. We're also in the midst of informative writing. The 8th graders wrote about "world changers" and the 7th graders wrote about Nazis or anti-Nazi activists. The 6th graders will begin an informative piece after the Thanksgiving holiday.

All three classes are beginning a new book as well. The 6th graders will be reading *The Giver*. The 7th graders are reading *The Boy in the Striped Pajamas* and the 8th graders are reading *Unbroken*.
