Hello St. Raphael Families,

My soul is weary with sorrow; strengthen me according to your word. Psalms 119:28

I would like to begin today by sharing a little more information concerning the school shooting event that happened this week at a neighboring city school. Information was sent home the day of as to how St. Raphael responded that day, but I also received a few questions about our school safety after that message. Let me share a little more information with you.

The school reviews and practices fire, tornado, earthquake, and active shooter drills each year. Over the past few years during the pandemic, many of the drills were discussed in class and/or virtually viewed within the classrooms. As the principal, I felt the students had enough to be concerned with virtual and modified classroom settings during that time. But this year, the emphasis must return to more active, hands-on drills and practices.

This week the teachers will present an age-appropriate Active Shooter video from the Archdiocese of St. Louis to their classes, followed by class discussions. After seeing the video, the school will practice the Active Shooter Drill in the classrooms the following week. The videos and practices are not intended to scare or worry our students but provide a measure of control over a very scary situation. Teachers, students, and parents each have an appropriate video to view.



Miss Patti Woods: English (4 & 5) Religion (4 & 7) Social Studies (4)

4th-grade Religion: We are beginning our studies of the Ten Commandments. We will be creating a slideshow, one slide for each of the Commandments.

4th-grade English: We are continuing our work with nouns in all forms: singular, plural, proper, common, singular possessive, and plural possessive. A test on the unit will be next week.

4th-grade Social Studies: We are going to be beginning our studies of the Civil War and how Missouri had an impact on it.

5th-grade English: We are continuing our work with nouns in all forms: singular, plural, proper, common, singular possessive, and plural possessive. A test on the unit will be next week.

7th-grade Religion: We are working our way through the Sacraments of Initiation as we get ready to begin preparing for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. We will be researching saints and begin narrowing down the choices of the saints that interest us, or "speak to us" to use as our Confirmation saint.

Mrs. Connie Holbrook: Religion (5), Math (4-6), Literature/Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: In Math, November will be focused on decimals, particularly the basics and adding and subtracting. This is a life skill in order to work with money, therefore we will work on money skills often. Reading class will be spent reading stories in book A. There will be a unit test before we begin book B. Vocabulary tests have also started and occur the week after the spelling tests. The Eucharist is what will be discussed in Religion class in November.

Fourth Grade: During Math class, the big push will be multiplication, beginning with multiplication facts. I am hoping to include some fun projects as well as teach some strategies for memorizing multiplication facts. During Literature class they have been reading stories from book A about hopes, dreams, and wishes. They will have a unit test for book A this month before book B is started. Vocabulary tests have also started and occur the week after the spelling tests.

Sixth Grade Standard Math: The students have done a great job working on decimals. A final review of the decimal concepts will happen in November and a test will be given. After that the students will study frac-

Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

4th Grade Science is learning about Energy, the different kinds (electrical, light, sound, mechanical, chemical) and how they transfer from one type to another. Also the difference between potential and kinetic energies.

5th Grade is learning about Chemical Formulas of Compounds.

6-7-8th Grades are learning about Acids, Bases and the pH Scale.

Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion: Grade six students are learning how the Israelites arrived in Egypt through the story of Joseph and his brothers. The eighth grade students are learning about the four Marks of the Church.

Social Studies: Students in grade six will be completing their study of European geography and cultures.

Grade eight students are about to begin their study of the Civil War.

Grade five students are working on the original thirteen British colonies.

Students in grade seven are completing their study of the history of Ancient China.

Mr. Zach Almeida: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

Algebra 2: Students are solving systems of linear equations and inequalities.

Challenge: Students are multiplying and dividing rational numbers.

Algebra 1: Students will work on solving and graphing compound inequalities.

Pre-Algebra: Students will solve problems using the Pythagorean Theorem.

Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8)

The middle-school students are prepping for NaNoWriMo (National Novel Writing Month)--a month-long writing project. They are outlining their stories, getting suggestions from their peers on plot events they can include, and figuring out who their characters are. These are longer stories--for example, the 6th graders' stories will be at least 5,000 words long. This may seem like a daunting task, but this is the only thing we will do for one 45-minute session each day--we will work on our stories.

The Bellarmine Speech League performers are practicing for the first meet in November. Most duets/soloists have memorized their piece, and are now refining it with gestures, facial expressions and movement.

Mr. John McDermott: Physical Education

I am very excited to be starting our next unit! We will be starting our basketball unit. We will be practicing dribbling, passing and shooting. The older kids will be playing full scrimmages in class. I am excited to see everyone develop their skills!
