4th Grade Math~We have been exploring the properties of multiplication and division by predicting outcomes and exploring inequalities.

6th Grade Standard Math~We are working through all things fractions! 6th Grade Challenge Math~We have been working on adding/subtracting/multiplying/dividing decimals. After the fall break we will attack fractions!

Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

4TH GRADE SCIENCE - We are finishing up different forms of energy transfer, and renewable energy sources. And will be going into studying WAVES (Sound and Light Waves) and the Parts of a Wave.

5TH Grade Science - We are finishing SOLUTIONS, COMPOUNDS, and MIXTURES. And will be going into Chemical Change versus Physical Change.

6.7.8TH Graders - Just TESTED over Cellular Respiration (Aerobic and Anaerobic) and Photosynthesis. And are starting the DIFFERENT STAGES OF CELL CYCLE, and MITOSIS and MEIOSIS.

Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion:

Grade Six students have discovered how the Israelites came to Egypt. They are going to learn about Moses and the Exodus.

Grade Eight students are learning about the four Marks of the Catholic Church. They are currently studying the mark of "Holy."

Social Studies:

Grades Five and Eight are working on American History. Both classes are exploring the area of the thirteen original English colonies.

Grade Six students are looking at the cultures and geography of Latin America.

Grade Seven students have completed their study of Ancient Egypt and are beginning to learn about Ancient India.

Mrs. Anne Stein: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

In Middle School, the 7th Grade Challenge class is working on solving problems with integers, finding greatest common factors and least common multiples, and comparing rational numbers. The Pre-Algebra class is working on writing and graphing functions. The Algebra I class is working on solving inequalities and identifying and writing functions. The Algebra II class is working with systems of inequalities and equations.

Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8)

6th-8th ELA

The 8th graders had the opportunity to do some community service, so on Saturday, Oct. 21 seven of the 8th graders took part in St. Louis' Trash Bash. They spent the morning helping clean up Willmore Park, armed with gloves and trash bags. We'll be doing a project every quarter.

The middle--schoolers are going to begin NaNoWriMo on November 1. NaNoWriMo stands for National Novel Writing Month, and is actually an international project. Writers from all over the world write at a frenetic pace. If you're 17 or older, your word count goal is 50,000 words. Students at SRA have the following goals:

6th grade--6,000 words

7th grade--7,000 words

8th grade--8,000 words

Students can write whatever kind of story they want--sci-fi, fantasy, historical fiction, etc. In our writing classes, we'll be doing nothing but working on our stories... because all the magic begins on November 1st and ends on November 30! Let the fun begin...

Mr. John McDermott: Physical Education

This month, we have been working on basketball across all grade levels. The elementary students have been working on different basketball skills in small groups while the upper grade students worked on skills and played scrimmages. We finished off our basketball unit with scrimmages and an optional free throw competition.
