Mrs. Dana Lahm: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

In science, we have had a great start to the new school year! Grades 4th through 8th have learned the basics of how science is completed through the scientific method. Each student then applied their scientific skills while conducting M&M experiments tailored to their grade level.

Fourth Grade Science

As part of the Ecology Unit, we are learning about different habitats and the characteristics and needs of all living things. Students then demonstrated their understanding by creating drawings of a particular habitat of their choice.

Fifth Grade Science

We are studying living organisms and the classification and differences of vertebrates and invertebrates. Students then researched and classified an animal of their choice before depicting the information in a drawing.

Sixth, Seventh, and Eighth Grade Science

Students practiced their scientific inquiry skills by completing a project that featured a real-world interactive simulation on how to combat malaria. Then we conducted an in-depth study of the scientific method and metric system. Lastly, students learned how to: identify experimental variables, write hypotheses, create data tables and graphs, and interpret experimental results from written scenarios.

Miss Patti Woods: English (4 & 5) Religion (4 & 7) Social Studies (4)

Welcome back to school! It's been a long time, but the kids seem excited to be here, and I know I am excited to be here as well. People have worked very hard to get our classrooms ready for us so we can attend class in person, and we are grateful! Thank you for all the prayers and hard work that went into making this happen.

In 4th grade religion the students are learning about how faith is believing without seeing, and how the pope is the leader of our church here on earth. They learned about the Incarnation of Jesus and about the sacrament of Baptism.

In 4th grade social studies students have been learning about how our country started, the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights.

4th and 5th grade classes have both just finished the first unit in their textbooks and have taken the unit test. Both classes are now beginning their first essay which is a personal narrative.

In 7th grade religion the students are learning about books of the Bible, specifically the Gospels. They are also taking a close look at the early Christians.







Mrs. Amanda Knauer: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: We have had a fantastic start to the new school year! The students are getting into the new school routine. During religion class, the focus has been on how Jesus worships and how we can imitate Him. In math, our attention has been on place value and being able to compare and round numbers. We have also been working on multiplication. During Literature, the students have been working on summarizing, determining theme, and identifying cause and effect.

Fourth Grade: I have enjoyed getting to know the fourth graders in the classroom setting. In math, the students are learning place value and how to write numbers through the millions in standard, expanded, and word form. We are also working on comparing and ordering large numbers. During literature, the students read a short story about a small child going owl hunting with his dad. The students learned about similes and metaphors and how comparing two different things can help you make connections more easily. We also read a story about a princess and worked on comparing and contrasting characters within the story along with another story.

We have a new social studies program for the upper grades called Discovery Education Social Studies. This program replaced the old textbooks that we had been using. 
Miss Ashley Schaaf Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

In challenge math we are working with integers.


In pre-algebra we will be exploring functions and sequences.
