Miss Patti Woods: English (4 & 5) Religion (4 & 7) Social Studies (4)



We are loving our new dry erase tables and standing desks in fourth grade! We can practice spelling words and math problems. Group work will be fun too!



Mrs. Amanda Knauer: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: During Religion class, the students have been focusing on the Sacraments of Initiation. We started with Baptism, learning about how we enter into God's family. Then we discussed how we renew that faith in Confirmation through receiving the Holy Spirit. Finally we talked about the first Eucharist and what happened during Passover and the Last Supper. Next, we will be learning about the Parts of the Mass. In Math, the students have been working on how to write and solve expressions and equations. During Literature, the students have read a few short stories and focused on setting, sequencing, and summarizing.

Fourth Grade: During Math, our main focus has been on multiplication. The students are working hard on memorizing their facts quickly. In Literature, the students have read a few short stories. With our short stories, the students have worked on sequencing, setting, mood and main ideas.

#### Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

Fourth grade just finished learning how to measure using the Metric System, meters, centimeters, millimeters, etc...and metric conversion.

Fifth graders are learning molecules and compounds, and are doing an Electrolysis Lab splitting water molecules.

Sixth, Seventh & Eighth Graders just learned how to program EV3 Lego Robots completing Challenge 1 and Challenge 2 maneuvers, and are just starting to build spaghetti towers to test if they are Earthquake Resistant on a Shake Table.

#### Mr. John McDermott: Physical Education





This month we finished volleyball. We practiced bumps, sets, serves, and spikes. We also did full scrimmages with the upper grades. We are currently doing basketball. We will be working on dribbling, shooting, and other skills.

Religion: Students in 6th grade have learned about Jacob and Esau and are beginning to learn about Joseph, the favorite son of Israel.

Grade 5 students completed their unit on Roanoke and Jamestown and are beginning to learn about early colonial history.


Mr. Zach Almeida: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)
