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Miss Patti Woods: English (4 & 5) Religion (4 & 7) Social Studies (4)

We are all glad that testing week is over and our schedule is returning to normal. We missed going to all our specials and definitely missed going to the library! We ended the week with a field trip to the park with everyone from the upper grades.

4th grade Religion: We are talking about God offering us eternal life with Him.

4th grade Social Studies: We are beginning our studies of The Constitution and the Declaration of Independence.

4th & 5th grade English: We are beginning the unit on nouns and will be writing a story to entertain. 7th grade Religion: We have been focusing on the Infancy Narratives and will to into Mary and the Apostles.

# Mrs. Amanda Knauer: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

5th Grade: During Religion class, the students have been looking up and reading passages from the Bible and learning about the sacrament of Baptism. In Math, the 5th graders have been studying estimating numbers, comparing and ordering large numbers, and multiplying multi-digit numbers. In Literature, the students have read a few short stories and they focused on the literary elements of similes and metaphors, questioning, sequencing, and summarizing.

4th Grade: During Math, the 4th graders have worked on comparing and ordering large numbers, estimating sums and differences, and calculating the sum and difference of large numbers. The students worked with a few short stories during Literature. With those stories we focused on connecting to the text, comparing and contrasting both within the text and with another text, summarizing, and visualizing.



# Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

4th Grade Science is learning the LAW of Conservation of Energy—"Energy can NOT be created or Destroyed. Only converted from one form to another".

5th Grade Science is learning the Periodic Table and how it's arranged.

6-7-8 Grade Science is learning about Alfred Wegener's Theory of Continental Drift and Professor Harry Hess's Theory of Sea-Floor Spreading merging into today's modern Theory of Plate Tectonics.

### Mr. John McDermott: Physical Education

We just finished our unit on ultimate frisbee. It seems like most of the students are excited to move on to volleyball next. In this unit, students will be learning the rules and skills required to play volleyball. We will work on setting, bumping, spiking, and serving. This change is a departure from the curriculum guide posted at the beginning of the year. This change was made in accordance with the CYC schedule.



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Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion: Students in Grade 6 are completing the first unit in their book. This unit covered many of the stories found in the Book of Genesis. Grade 8 students are also about to complete their first unit as well. They have learned about the images and models of the Catholic Church.

Social Studies: Grade 7 & 8 students are working on American History. 7th grade students are learning about the early Spanish explorers to the New World, and the 8th grade students are learning about the Civil War. As one of their activities, the 8th grade students are also creating their own sewing kit that would have been similar to those used by Civil War soldiers. 6th grade students will begin a unit on Ancient Egypt; students in Grade 5 are learning about Christopher Columbus as well as early Spanish explorers.

Mr. Zach Almeida: Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

Challenge: Students are working on comparing rational numbers by converting between fractions and decimals.

Pre-Algebra: Students are graphing linear equations using tables.

Algebra 1: Students are solving problems using the Pythagorean Theorem.

Algebra 2: Students are graphing linear equations in standard form by finding x and y-intercepts.



Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8)

#### Middle School ELA

The students are currently working on rough draft memoirs. They will choose one so they can finish, revise, edit and put the finishing touches on it. We will then have a writing buffet. Which is a kind of "buffet" that doesn't involve food but instead involves delicious stories.

In our literature classes we're reading a variety of books. We're reading classic novels like A Separate Peace, classic mysteries like Agatha Christie's And Then There Were None, beautifully crafted novels like Kate DeCamillo's The Tiger Rising along with a few other titles.



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
